This matter came before the Court on April 20, 2012 for a hearing on the motion of Plaintiff Stephen Deese ("Mr. Deese") pursuant to CR 65.03 for a restraining order. Mr. Deese was present in person and was represented by counsel. Defendant Genscape, Inc. ("Genscape") was present by counsel.

Motion having been made, argument presented and the Court being otherwise sufficiently advised;

THE COURT FINDS, for the reasons stated on the record and incorporated herein by reference, as follows:

- 1. It clearly appears from the specific facts shown by the verified complaint and affidavit of Mr. Deese that loss of the employment opportunity in question would constitute immediate and irreparable injury, loss or damage to Mr. Deese;
- 2. The specific facts shown by the verified

 Complaint and affidavit of Mr. Deese evidence a good

 faith basis for his belief that assertion by Genscape

of its perceived rights under the "Non-Competition;

Non Solicitation" clause set out under paragraph 3.1

of the Employee Proprietary Information and Inventions

Agreement (the Agreement") would constitute a

violation of Mr. Deese's rights should that Agreement

ultimately prove to be unenforceable. However, it

does not clearly appear from the specific facts shown

by the verified Complaint and affidavit of Mr. Deese

that his rights are being or will be violated by

Genscape.

Wherefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

- 1. Mr. Deese's motion for a restraining order
 is respectfully DENIED;
- 2. This matter is continued to 5:00 p.m. on April 24, 2012 for a hearing on Mr. Deese's motion pursuant to CR 65.04 for a temporary injunction.
